Hello! Sam Currall here (piano accompanist at Faith). My nephew Austin finally got to go home on February 19th in Idaho Falls, ID from his two month long stay at the Children's Hospital in Salt Lake City. He went home on TPN, which is nutrients given to him through his veins, since he can't keep any food or feeding tube formula down.

Since he's been home, he's had to go to the local hospital every week to be treated for a fever and/or infection of some sort. He's also having weekly chemo at the local hospital, which he's having a really hard time with.

Now, he's once again at the Children's Hospital in Salt Lake City for more intensive care because he has had a fever for days and came back positive for COVID, rhinovirus and a bacterial infection in his blood. He's really not feeling well at all. He did have scans done and all the tumors in his lungs have been steadily shrinking, which is very good news.

This is all very hard on my brother Mike and his wife Bridget (Austin's parents) and Austin's five siblings. Mike still hasn't been back to work.

It's rare to pull into the parking lot and not see cars here — for meetings or events, using Community Center for sports or gatherings, campus work projects or preparing for worship, in line for drop off & pickup or P.I.E. meetings. So, I thought it might be worthwhile to mention some of the great things that are happening around here.

Around the SCHOOL and CHILD CARE

Throughout this year, we've been seeing continued growth in Faith Lutheran School. **New students continue to come**, even as we are already open for registration for this next year! We've already had **one middle school student baptized**, and are scheduling another one. In early March, our **School and Child Care staff had emergency response training** through a program called A.L.I.C.E. We are just nearing completion of a **renewed kids' garden** behind the Quad Building. Finally, we had a **baby shower for our School Secretary**, Shelby Williams, as she and her husband anticipate the birth of their second child.

At our COMMUNITY CENTER

The gym and rooms of our Community Center are in nearly constant use. Obviously, there are sports teams and celebration events, but did you know that we have **2 Hispanic congregations worshipping there each Sunday**? There are many projects being anticipated, including our **Easter Morning Breakfast** and upcoming **Faith Lutheran Auction**. As we continue to recognize not only needs but opportunities, the P.I.E. Board from FLS will be purchasing a **portable stage** for the Community Center. In addition, we are making changes to **the sound system** in the gym to improve quality and usability. These improvements will allow us to be one of the host sites for a Christian Concert Series this coming summer!

In our FAITH COMMUNITY

We have been blessed throughout our campus to have **upgraded our phone system and internet access**. As costs were going up, the Lord provided for our needs. Justin Bevers has been providing **youth ministry events** every other Saturday. We have continued to have **visitors to worship each**

week, and are continuing to implement **connections with school families** as well. We currently have **6 students in our Confirmation program**. **The worship team** for our late service **has been growing**, adding two new members. It should be noted that we are also thankful for our **Altar Guild** that keeps our worship space equipped and ready, spending a ton of time behind the scenes. In February we sent three people (myself, included) to the **Best Practices for Ministry** conference in Phoenix, AZ, and we anticipate sending several more this next year. **Our Board of Elders has recently grown by 2**, allowing our team to better serve our congregation in care and worship. Our **Council** continues to provide faithful stewardship and support for our ministries. We are currently arranging for **better signage** on campus, particularly to help guests know where they need to go.

I know that this list is not exhaustive, but it at least identifies many of the significant and ongoing work that is done across all four parts of our ministry. Please thank those responsible for various aspects of our ongoing ministry together!

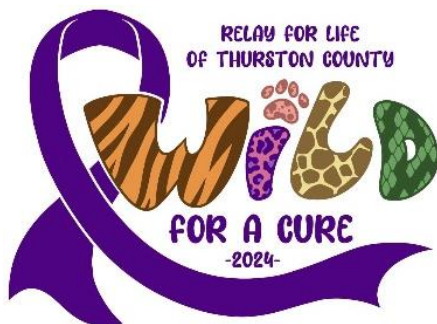

Lifeline Screening

Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings, will offer affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at Faith Community Center on **Friday, April 12, 2024**.

A package of four screenings to identify risk for stroke, heart disease and other chronic conditions will be offered:

Carotid Artery Screening (Plaque)

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.¹

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA)

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery, which is a serious medical emergency.

Atrial Fibrillation

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation. AFib can lead to blood clots, stroke, and heart failure, and other heart-related complications.²

Giving is a *Breeze*

The Church uses a software program that deals with social needs of the Church. This software is called Breeze. It allows for an easier way of getting information out to the Church members as a whole as well as small groups.

One aspect of this software is it has a modular that we can track church contribution.

Please be aware the Breeze on-line giving bank transfer feature does include a processing fee of 1%. The processing fee for credit cards is 2.9% plus a small transaction fee. Faith will absorb these fees but you have the option to give back both the transfer and credit card processing fees by simply checking the box. Upon doing so, the fees will be added to your donation.

Texting is a *Breeze*

With this software, we have an extended opportunity to communicate with you through text messaging. We are able to generate messages through the app directly to your phone. These messages are legitimate and not spam or fraudulent. Please make sure your information is up to date with the church office so you don't miss important notifications.



Text to Give

To donate by text, a donor simply:

1. Text the amount they'd like to give to **(360) 732-8020** (e.g. \$50). Remember to include a space between your dollar amount and your keyword. If a user submits \$50Missions, they will receive a "Sorry, not sure what you meant" error message. The proper format must be \$50 Missions in order for the command to be received properly.
2. If a person has donated by text before, they'll receive a text in response confirming that their gift has been received successfully and they're done.
3. If it's the first time a person is donating by text, they'll be sent a message that says, "It looks like you are a new giver; to begin: (link provided). It will be a link to the church's online giving page. Clicking on the link they will be asked to supply their payment method (credit card, debit card, or bank account). This payment source will then be linked with their phone number so that, in the future, all they will need to do is text in the amount. (They will not need to re-enter their payment information.)"
4. If the donor didn't specify a fund by keyword, donations will automatically go to the default fund in Breeze. **Example giving by keyword: \$50 missions** Note: *Donors can only give to one fund at a time.*

Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have ever bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a “title search.” Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you’ll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, “That’s mine: I had it first.”

You can’t understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor’s money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor’s possessions are *his*: you don’t have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership *to you*? Paul says, “Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price” (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God’s leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since *you* belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.

This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.
