A New Look Around Campus

You may have noticed a few changes around campus that have brightened things up a bit! We've been working on some projects that we hope to complete in the next month or two that feature our ministries working together. Students from Mrs. Green's art classes have produced original art pieces that have been mounted on the Church and FCC. More art is coming from the art classes and from the Childcare kids as well. These art pieces give our students a chance to contribute something to add color and life to the campus, and visitors can appreciate the work of our students at the same time. The art is produced on simple plywood frames, and can be easily updated each school year for a fresh look.

Another project in progress in front of the FCC is the "adopt a pot" program. We've placed several clay pots near the FCC entrance, and several of the school classrooms are going to "adopt" a pot. They will decorate it, plant something in it, and care for the plant over the course of the school year. This is another chance to show off our students work and beautify the campus at the same time!

In mid-November, we brought in 90 yards of playground bark to complete the Middle School play area expansion and to fill out the playground. To keep up with safety standards, new bark needs to be brought in every year or two on the playground as the old bark wears down or is blown away over time. It brings a fresh look and smell of cedar! The best part is that the company brings a truck with a blower and blows the bark into place instead of having to manually spread it. That saves us a lot of time and difficult labor.

A few people made a special request, supported by a donation to fund the request, to install an electric door opener on the Church women's bathroom door. In early November, D'Angelo Bache volunteered over 12 hours of his time to install the opener and wiring for the opener and buttons. It's working great and has received great reviews! D'Angelo is an electrician by trade, and I could not have done the installation without him. Thank you, D, for your generosity and dedication!

I also want to thank John Schmedake for stepping up to volunteer as Trustee board chair! I'm looking forward to working closely with John to continue to improve the campus at Faith and upgrade our procedures to keep things running smoothly.

We always need volunteers to help with various projects around campus, whether it's mowing, weeding, painting, fixing things, cleaning, organizing, and so much more. Giving is a Breeze

The Church uses a software program that deals with social needs of the Church. This software is called Breeze. It allows for an easier way of getting information out to the Church members as a whole as well as small groups.

One aspect of this software is it has a modular that we can track church contribution.

To establish your on-line giving using the Breeze online giving program, follow the link:

Please be aware the Breeze on-line giving bank transfer feature does include a processing fee of 1%. The processing fee for credit cards is 2.9% plus a small transaction fee. Faith will absorb these fees but you have the option to give back both the transfer and credit card processing fees by simply checking the box. Upon doing so, the fees will be added to your donation.

Texting is a Breeze

With this software, we have an extended opportunity to communicate with you through text messaging. We are able to generate messages through the app directly to your phone. These messages are legitimate and not spam or fraudulent. Please make sure your information is up to date with the church office so you don't miss important notifications.



Text to Give

To donate by text, a donor simply:

- 1. Text the amount they'd like to give to (360) 732-8020 (e.g. \$50). Remember to include a space between your dollar amount and your keyword. If a user submits \$50Missions, they will receive a "Sorry, not sure what you meant" error message. The proper format must be \$50 Missions in order for the command to be received properly.
- 2. If a person has donated by text before, they'll receive a text in response confirming that their gift has been received successfully and they're done.
- 3. If it's the first time a person is donating by text, they'll be sent a message that says, "It looks like you are a new giver; to begin: (link provided). It will be a link to the church's online giving page. Clicking on the link they will be asked to supply their payment method (credit card, debit card, or bank account). This payment source will then be linked with their phone number so that, in the future, all they will need to do is text in the amount. (They will not need to re-enter their payment information.)
- 4. If the donor didn't specify a fund by keyword, donations will automatically go to the default fund in Breeze. **Example giving by keyword:** \$50 missions Note: *Donors can only give to one fund at a time*.

The Measure of Our Generosity

If you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8–11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regulation no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?
